We are looking for a motivated student to work on a project for 3-6 months, potentially as a part of their MSc or BSc student thesis or as a student project.

The project 'Including Indigenous Perspectives in Emerging Greenlandic Resource *Exploration*' is funded by the Carlsbergfoundation and will survey local views and public opinions about exploiting sand as a possible developing natural resource in Greenland.

The project will explore societal, economic and environmental factors related to a potential sand mining industry. How can Greenland move forward with an inclusive and open approach to climate adaptation that takes into account the concerns and experiences from local communities around Greenland? We are currently surveying these questions, where a unique dataset is composed to serve as an essential part of the project.
